Topic of the Month: The 2020-2021 School Year

We are excited to let you know that our Superintendent, the District Review Team, and the Central Review Team have approved the School Programming Model that we submitted for hybrid learning. We had to make a few tweaks to the one that we presented to families a few weeks ago, but we will be emailing students what days and times they will be scheduled to be in the building later today.

While we are glad that we now have a schedule to work with, there are still many unknowns about the fall. As of today, the NYC Department of Education has not yet released the 2020-2021 calendar and so we do not, officially, know when the first day of school will be (though there is a tentative September 10<sup>th</sup> start date). Throughout the summer we have been working hard to plan for the fall while adhering to the DOE guidelines and policies that continue to be announced. As always, we want to make sure that we are being as transparent as possible around our decision-making and that we are addressing questions and concerns from students/parents. In order to do that we have scheduled grade-level Zoom meetings for students and parents/guardians on the following dates (please only attend the meeting for your grade level):

- Class of 2024 Tuesday, September 1<sup>st</sup> at 2 PM (zoom link will be emailed out 15-30 minutes prior to the meeting time)
- Class of 2023 Wednesday, September 2<sup>nd</sup> at 2PM (zoom link will be emailed out 15-30 minutes prior to the meeting time)
- Class of 2022 Thursday, September 3<sup>rd</sup> at 2 PM (zoom link will be emailed out 15-30 minutes prior to the meeting time)
- Class of 2021 Friday, September 4<sup>th</sup> at 2 PM (zoom link will be emailed out 15-30 minutes prior to the meeting time)

We are hopeful that there will be many fewer uncertainties by September 1<sup>st</sup> so that we can share with you all the most up to date and concrete information we have. We look forward to seeing you all on the above dates to share our plans and our thinking with you and to answer any questions that you may have.

## **NEWS & REMINDERS...**

• The online scheduling form for the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter is now closed. We will be reviewing each student's course selections to be sure that all students are taking the courses they need to make progress towards graduation. Students will receive an e-mail prior to the 1<sup>st</sup> day of school with a list of the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter courses they are enrolled in. Please note that although we always do our best to ensure all students take the courses that interest them, it is not possible for every student to enroll in their first choice of classes all the time. • Help us achieve our goal this year! Every year all students are required to submit a lunch form either electronically or by returning a paper copy. Last year, 91% of our families submitted lunch forms. This year we are hoping that, at least, 95% of families will submit their lunch form.
